DNR water appropriation application fee increase

As we shared through the August edition of the MN Irrigator, DNR water appropriation permit application fees have increased as of January 1, 2026. The Minnesota State Legislature approved the fee increase during the 2025 legislative session. The permit application fee was last changed in 2005 from \$75 to \$150 per permit application.

The fee increases support the changing demands on water resources and the need for the DNR to review permit applications, conduct technical analyses, and manage water supplies and data across the state.

Any new permit applications, amend-

ment requests or transfers will be required to pay \$600 per permit application, amendment request or transfer.

What will the DNR do with the increase in fees?

It will take some time for the new fees collected to be realized in program improvements and catch up with the accumulated work, but the DNR expects the fee increases will support:

- Technical review and analyses of new applications and existing permits, with increasing demands for available water.

Bregier will take over as membership secretary. I would like to thank both of them for taking on these roles. Marlene and Anna are both currently transitioning into these roles. With this change, I just want to make everybody aware that there will be a change in address to where you will send your membership forms and other mailing items, so please be on the lookout for that.

Moving on to some legislative items. As you are aware, IAM authored a bill during last year's legislative session. The bill was introduced in both the House and the Senate. Because of the timing of when the bill was introduced, it did not receive a hearing in the appropriate committees.

Over the last few months, IAM, along with our lobbyists have had discussions about how we would like to move forward with the bill in this upcoming legislative session, which starts on February 17. One of these discussions has been with Agri-Growth, which is an organization that represents many sectors of the agricultural industry in Minnesota. Agri-Growth has been working on some DNR permit reform language and there is on-going discussion between the two organizations about the possibility of combining Agri-Growth's bill with IAM's language. Both

IAM and Agri-Growth plan on meeting with the DNR before the session starts to discuss different options.

Also, prior to session, IAM plans on attending an agriculture summit legislative listening session taking place in Fergus Falls at the end of January. Several legislator's and commissioners from different agencies will be on hand to discuss ways to support agriculture across Minnesota. We look forward to the event and appreciate the opportunity to be involved in the discussion. As we move into February, IAM will also be attending one of Attorney General Keith Ellison's future of Minnesota's water task force meetings in Mankato. At the event we will hopefully get an opportunity to share a small piece of our story and promote ag in general to a group that is unfamiliar with what we do.

Minnesota Ag Weather Network

The MDA and local partners operate 40 weather stations in the Minnesota Ag Weather Network (MAWN). Another 24 stations in the state are owned and operated by the North Dakota Ag Weather Network (NDAWN), a vital partner in the project.

Providing accurate and detailed local weather data within 20 miles of ag areas across the state is a goal of the project. Up to 80 total stations may be necessary to achieve this goal.

Information gathered at each site is integrated into NDAWN, which developed tools and applications to make the data readily accessible to the public.

Minnesota station data is available at: ndawn.ndsu.nodak.edu and ndawn.info/centralmn.html.

The network relies upon landowners across the state willing to host weather stations. Each weather station is installed in an area of about 30x30 feet (0.02 acres) on land not enrolled in the Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) or the Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program (CREP) due to program rules. The intent is to operate on each site for at least 50 years. Landowners interested in hosting a station can complete the Minnesota

Ag Weather Station Host Application.

Weather Station Details

- Each weather station is solar powered and transmits data over a cellular network every 5 minutes.
- Stations monitor weather up to 33 feet in the air, and soil conditions down to 7.5 feet below the surface, including rain and snow, air temperature and humidity, wind speed, solar radiation, and soil temperature and moisture.
- Research-grade monitoring equipment is used to ensure high-quality and valuable data.


Network Expansion

In 2023, the MDA received funding from the Clean Water Fund to expand the weather station network to agricultural areas statewide (green shading on the map). The initial expansion of about 40 additional weather stations began in 2024 and will be completed in cooperation with local partners over the next few years.

- Air temperature
- Wind direction and speed
- Relative humidity
- Dew point temperature
- Soil temperatures to 7.5 feet
- Soil moisture to 40 inches
- Solar radiation
- Snow depth and snow water equivalent

- Optimize the timing for fall application of fertilizer and manure, and termination of cover crop
- Reduce loss of nutrients, keep nutrients available for next season's crop

- Reducing the backlog in permit applications requiring technical review and analysis for more complex project proposals and applications.
- DNR compliance efforts with existing permit terms and conditions in areas with limited water availability and increasing demands for water resources.
- Improved understanding of aquifers across

the state and sharing this information with existing permit holders and new applicants.

The DNR is required to balance competing management objectives that include both the development and protection of Minnesota's water resources. Minnesota law also requires the DNR to manage water resources for current and future generations. This includes domestic supplies,

agriculture, fish and wildlife habitat, recreation, power generation and, in some situations, navigation.



MDA Reminders for Installers, Operators

Chemigation & Fertigation Permit Requirements

Chemigation permits are issued by the Minnesota Department of Agriculture (MDA) to operators who apply fertilizer (fertigation) and/or pesticide through an irrigation system that is connected to a water source.

To obtain a chemigation permit, the operator must submit a permit application to the MDA, pay the required fee, and meet the permit requirements that include the installation of the required antipollution device(s) (check valves) that are approved.

A list of MDA approved check valves can be found at the MDA's webpage at www.mda.state.mn.us/chemicals/fertilizers/chemigation.aspx. The operator must apply for a permit one time. A new permit is required when the operator of the system changes which occurs due to the sale or lease of the farming operation or business.

In center pivot chemigation systems another name for an antipollution device is a check valve. Two (2) MDA approved check valves in a series must be installed when applying pesticide.

When applying fertilizer, a single MDA approved main line check valve is required. A check valve must also be installed on the injection pump or line. The fertilizer and/or pesticide must be injected into the irrigation stream after

the main line check valve(s).

Mainline check valves, springs and automatic low pressure drains: We're seeing more and more instances where check valve springs have broken/failed and automatic low pressure drains

plugged. Growers are strongly urged to open the mainline check valve bodies and inspect these items at least annually before the season begins.

Financial assistance available for irrigation technology upgrades

To apply for funding contact your local SWCD office and submit a conservation program application. The deadline for applying for financial assistance is February 27, 2026, but contact your SWCD office early to ensure a timely application.

Irrigation technologies available for financial assistance include e.g., soil moisture sensors, irrigation water management, remote data access and remote operation control, upgrades of sprinklers or panels, fertigation retrofits, pump upgrades including upgrades to variable frequency drive pumps, irrigation pipeline, variable rate irrigation technology, and drip tape system upgrades.

Financial assistance is available for technology upgrades to irrigation systems located within the Anoka, Becker, Benton, Cass, Clay, Dakota, Douglas, East Otter Tail, Grant, Hubbard, Isanti, Kandiyohi, Meeker, Mille Lacs, Morrison, Pope, Sherburne, Stearns, Stevens, Swift, Todd, Wadena, Washington, West Otter Tail, Wilkin and Wright Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) service areas.

You apply for funding by contacting your local SWCD office and submitting a conservation program application. The deadline for applying for financial assistance is February 27, 2026, but con-

tact your SWCD office early to ensure a timely application.


The funding is provided through a renewed agreement with the USDA's Regional Conservation Partnership Program (RCPP). It builds upon a \$3.5 million award for similar projects in 2021.

This initiative brings together a broad coalition of partners. The Minnesota Department of Agriculture, USDA-NRCS, the SWCDs listed above, the Irrigators Association of Minnesota, Central Lakes College Ag & Energy Center, AgCentric-Minnesota State, University of Minnesota, Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe, state agencies, irrigator's associations, and irrigation businesses have partnered to offer this program.

Irrigators receiving financial assistance will also receive a discount to participate in the Minnesota State Farm Business Management Program which provides an annual financial analysis of their operation.

The program will also help build irrigation-related technical expertise and information sharing among SWCD, NRCS and irrigation industry staff, and organize field days and irrigation technology demonstration events.



Annual MN Irrigated Crop Acres Update

Permitted irrigated agricultural crops in Minnesota continue to grow each year. The blue bar graph gives a historical presentation of permitted irrigated acre growth over several selected years between 1960 and 2026. The green bars show the reported annual irrigated acres, and they have grown at a similar rate each year, some years show a slight variation from the mean depending on the weather temperature and rainfall conditions and irrigation needs.


